So what is 'Substances Hazardous to Health'?

In legal terms, these are substances that are classified as "very toxic, toxic, harmful, corrosive or Irritant" under the Classification, Labelling and Packaging Regulation (CLP). This course covers everything about the Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (COSHH) and is aimed at anyone working with hazardous substances.

This regulation came into effect in January 2009 dovetailing with a set of regulations called REACH. REACH is a European Union regulation concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals, which came into effect on 1st June 2007.

The main aim of REACH is to provide a high level of protection for human health and the environment from the use of chemicals.
